The right to add the initials MNWS under an artist's signature indicates they have been awarded Signature status, a prized achievement for artists whose work consistently demonstrates a high level of skill and sophistication of aesthetics.

Following the 2022 Spring Exhibition "Spring Forth", seven member artists were recognized as Signature Members for their achievement in artistic expression and volunteer work to support the mission of the Minnesota Watercolor Society.

To achieve the distinction of Signature Member in the Minnesota Watercolor Society, these accomplished artists each earned at least six points within a contiguous five year period. Points are earned for paintings juried into the Spring Exhibition and for awards given by the jurist in both Spring and Fall Exhibitions. Points are also earned though volunteering/holding a position on the MNWS Board of Directors.



From the President

Hello fellow artists and friends,

I hope you are enjoying our summer weather and all the activities and sightseeing that there is to do. Take photos for painting subjects to try in your studio or try a plein air attempt. My words to consider are:



KEEP IT SIMPLE

I was in a workshop a while ago and one of the sessions was on the 1, 2, 3 and 5 minute painting approach. First we taped off a sheet of watercolor paper to get (4) approx. 5 x 7 inch images on the paper. Then we selected our subject, mixed colors that we would be using, and the timer would start.

I chose a landscape, and in one minute I could get the sky,



the foreground and the mid to back ground shapes and colors on the paper. Absolutely no detail, I didn't even think about it.

Then in following we did 2, 3 and 5 minute approaches that allowed for shade, shadow and some

detail. When we looked at them together its amazing to see how well the one minute approach stacked up with the others in which we had more time to add "stuff". It got me to consider how I should approach the later stages of a painting, what's important and what is not.

This exercise got me thinking about a few years ago when I painted with my then 9 year-old nephew during one of their family visits to Minneapolis. We selected a subject and timed ourselves to finish in 7 minutes (because that's when dinner would be ready). We were both pleasantly surprised at the outcome when we had to make immediate decisions about what to include in the scene compared to what was in the subject photo.

So, back to my words to consider, try simplifying your work, don't add all the details so the viewer can fill them in, and you might find that your work is fresher and spontaneous, a winner!!

What does an author and illustrator do when the family has no health insurance, is one rent check away from being homeless, has a husband swearing at her all day long and the IRS breathing down her back? She keeps creating! Nancy continued to do books, but she also created a blog called "Putting One Foot In Front of the Other." Nancy is working on a graphic style memoir about her husbands FTD Journey.



Self Portrait of Kim Johnson Nechtman

Get loose, go outside the lines, and don't be afraid of watercolors! During this two day Zoom course, Kim will guide us through three different approaches to bird/animal subjects: a very direct painting approach, a wet-into-wet approach, and a unique "throwing paint" approach. Students will let their fears evaporate, learning instead to relax and open up their creativity and imaginations. We will explore making shapes, using color combinations, simultaneously designing foreground and background, and taking advantage of soft and hard edges. Students will gain confidence in reaching the point where they realize their painting is complete.

Cost: \$225 members, \$275 non-members Registration opens Monday, August 1, 2022. Refund minus \$25 up to September 15, after which no refund.
